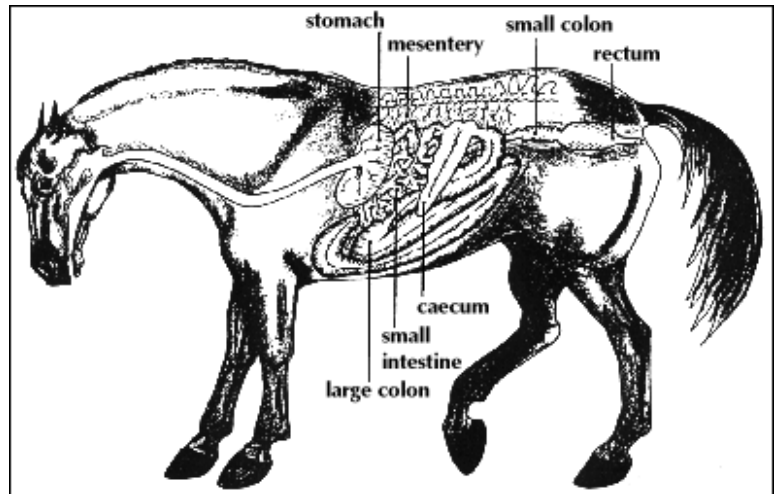

### Signs of Colic

- Not interested in food
- Looking or biting at sides
- Lying down/ getting up frequently
- Curling the upper lip (flehmen)
- Discomfort/sweating
- Lying down more than usual
- Frequently stretching as if to urinate
- Kicking at belly
- Rolling
- Pawing
